Funeral services for Wilson Pryor Corder, 92, of Mt. Rozell, will be Wednesday at 10:00 A.M. at Limestone Chapel, with Bro. Joe Teal and Bro. Larry Hicks officiating. Burial will be at the New Salem Cemetery. Visitation will be Tuesday night from 6 to 8 at the funeral home.

Wilson, who died on July 16, 2011, was born December 29, 1918 to Flora Chapman Corder and Richard Pryor Corder. He was a member of First Baptist Church of Athens where he was a member of the Celebration Choir. He was a graduate of Athens State College and a retired NASA engineer. He served in the Navy during World War II as a plane captain on the aircraft carrier USS Randolph.

He was preceded in death by his parents and his wife, Sarah Day Corder. Wilson loved the Lord and all of His creation and never met a person he didnt like. He was a generous, loving man, and was happiest when serving the Lord by singing praises to God with the choir.

He is survived by his wife, Arnette Corder, two nephews and their families, and numerous cousins.
